34TH GENERAL CHAPTER OF THE ASSUMPTIONISTS - JUNE 01-25, 2023ENICA NIRIT, SE

«We'll be landing in a week, so let's fasten our seatbelts...»

At the start of the final week of the Chapter, we need to pick up the pace to give a good roadmap to the Superior General and his team... and to the whole Congregation.

Monday saw three highlights:

- A Rereading of the Acts of the 2017 General Chapter, by Fathers Michel Kubler and Wilfrid Kibanda, including the decisions taken and their implementation
- A rereading of the work of the capitulants by Frs. Richard Lamoureux and Chi Ai Nguyen, to draw out the main lines and priorities in view of the Chapter Acts
- Discussions on various documents from the Lay-Religious Alliance, Communication and Digital Continent and Abuse Prevention Commissions.

This Tuesday, the work of discernment continues. Please continue to pray for the Spirit to inspire us in what God expects of us.



Alberto's listening points

«During this Chapter, the question of evaluation came up several times.



It's a question of accepting to be evaluated in the tasks entrusted to us. To do this, we need an external viewpoint. It's a task for religious and lay people alike. One of the most urgent calls in our churches is for structural reform, taking into account the systemic nature of the issues. It's a question of reform and conversion for the Kingdom.

Rereading the work of the capitulants

At present, the following lines are emerging:

- Narrative, that is, recounting the experience we are having during this Chapter, a spiritual experience.
- The «steps to take» to express our charism and mission in specific areas such as formation (for all), fraternity, holiness...

Discussions lasted all morning, enriching these two re-readings. A few points of emphasis among many others:

- Be attentive to the world's calls: divisions, wars, the energy transition, climate, ecology, secularization and the quest for meaning, the challenge of religions: evangelical groups and other responses to today's spiritual quest...
- Talking about holiness in words that speak to our contemporaries
- Mention both our frailties and the signs of hope, signs of the Kingdom already here.
- Propose the «next step», the conversions to be undertaken.
- Return to our sources, notably Father Emmanuel d'Alzon and Saint Augustine.

So there's an urgent need to reappropriate d'Alzon so that his spirit can truly irrigate our bodies. So there's an urgent need for formation, but this doesn't just concern young religious!» - Father Dominique Greiner, editor-in-chief of «La Croix», Paris.

Mi Hogar Asuncionista Foundation, Bogota (Colombia)

The Mi Hogar Asuncionista Foundation is a social project created within the Lay-Religious Alliance to meet the needs of children, young people and the elderly in precarious situations.

Here we present two projects with children and teenagers.

1. The «Educate with Love» program - Children

This project aims to teach the primary emotions (anger, joy, surprise, fear, sadness) and the importance of mastering them in different contexts (school, social, family). Once this was done, in the final phase of the project, the teaching of socio-emotional skills began. These skills are needed in the different scenarios in which they find themselves, in order to improve their quality of life.

2. The «Educating with Love» program - Pre-teens

This program aims to strengthen social skills and self-esteem for the realization of their life project, and to provide tools that act as protective factors in favor of adolescents' mental health and guidance, thus ensuring their well-being and development in the different areas of their lives.

Message from Cardinal Orani Joao Tempesta, Archbishop of Rio de Janeiro (Brazil) to Father Ngoa Ya Tshihemba, Superior General of the Augustinians of the Assumption

Initiatives to know

Two studies on internally displaced persons (IDPs) from war at the Université de l'Assomption au Congo (UAC), Butembo



UAC is concerned about the situation of the local population.

It has carried out two studies, one in 2020, evaluating the work of the

High Commission for Refugees (HCR) and other humanitarian organizations in the Beni and Lubero territories, to enable them to adjust their interventions.

The other, in 2022, to measure the vulnerability of displaced people in the Beni area and propose primary health actions to be implemented.

In addition to proposing effective actions, these studies provide invaluable information on the situation of the population and identify the causes of insecurity.

Father Wilfrid Kibanda, Rector of the UAC, notes that «due to the activism of armed groups scouring the Kivu region, in particular local militias (Maï-Maï) and foreign armed groups (the ADF* in Beni territory and the FDLR** in the southern part of Lubero territory), many villages and towns are being emptied of their inhabitants. They prefer to settle in supposedly safer urban areas. Various atrocities committed against civilians, including mass killings and hostagetaking, are forcing people to move to the

nearest towns (Beni, Oicha...), leaving behind their means of subsistence. This phenomenon creates displaced IDPs». In May 2020, according to figures released by the International Organization for Migration (IOM), there were 39,207 IDPs. Most of them live and depend essentially on host families, whose incomes are significantly reduced by insecurity and economic recession due to protection measures against the COVID-19 pandemic.
