Presentation of the West African Vicariate

The Vicariate of West Africa was established on January 1, 2020, in conjunction with the Provinces of Africa and Madagascar. It comprises 60 religious.

- 37 brothers live in 5 communities in the three countries of the Vicariate: 21 brothers in Ouagadougou (Burkina Faso), 5 in Abidjan (Ivory Coast), 2 in Lomé and 9 in Sokodé (Togo).
- 33 brothers outside the Vicariate: 12 in France, 5 in Congo, 4 in Italy and Kenya, 2 in the Philippines and Madagascar, 1 in Belgium, England, Belgium, Jerusalem and Turkey.

The Vicariate provides all stages of formation in the Vicariate, from prenovitiate to philosophy and theology (the latter also in Kinshasa, Nairobi, Manila and Europe).

Apostolic commitments are

numerous: parish and youth ministry, secondary and higher education in various disciplines and locations, media and communications (including Bayard Afrique), support for internally displaced persons (due to terrorism), ecumenical and inter-religious dialogue...

Challenges and weaknesses common to all new foundations:

- Fragility: inconsistency, incoherence...
- Lack of self-sufficiency, with its corollary, economic dependence.
- Loss of a sense of authority
- A strong preoccupation with the question of works, «which sometimes coincides with pessimism».
- A certain insistence on specialized professional training.
- Cumulation of functions.
- Excessive attachment to the biological family

With a view to greater autonomy, the Vicariate will have to:

- Train religious in positions of responsibility, more stable, dedicated to a single mission.
- Work towards self-reliance
- Consider new foundations
- Listen to the various higher authorities of the Congregation.

Impressions

I was struck by the vitality of the young Vicariate, while recognizing some weaknesses that will dissipate as they come



of age. Well-equipped in terms of formation, the Vicariate offers every stage from pre-novitiate to philosophical and theological studies. Religious are present in all the activities that make up the Congregation: parish ministry, youth ministry, media work, support for internally displaced persons and inter-religious dialogue.

The youthfulness of the Vicariate means that energy needs to be better channeled (inconsistency, multiple activities, relationship with authority, skills to be supplemented, etc.), but it also brings an openness to working with others. Some brothers are involved in Bayard Africa, others have a «hummingbird «* presence in secondary and higher education establishments, or work in various institutes (philosophy, business, Islamic center or Protestant faculty...). Mobility within the Provinces and the hosting of religious facilitate the sharing of the charism.

If the Vicariate of West Africa aspires to growth, it wishes to rely on resources for each mission and to continue, inventing a relationship with the laity, in line with its needs.

* The hummingbird does not act for its own sake, but takes risks for others, thus becoming a powerful symbol of generosity.

The Vicariate covers 4 countries: South Korea, Vietnam, the Philippines and New Zealand.

Number of religious: 84 Vietnam 55, Philippines 22, South Korea 5, New Zealand 2 Brothers in formation 62

Number of communities: 11 Vietnam 6, Philippines 3, South Korea 1, New Zealand 1

In the Vicariate, the religious are young. They attract other young people.

One of the challenges is to transmit the charism and spirit of the Assumption.

There are big differences between the four countries: number of religious, apostolates, internationality with eight nationalities. While, because of language, internationality has been a problem in Vietnam since its foundation, Korea has Korean and Vietnamese brothers, and the Philippines is fortunate to have a greater diversity

In solidarity with the poor in orphanages in Saigon and Gwangju, the workers' home in Long An, the Restaurant du Coeur in Ba Ria, pastoral health care in Vinh, the actions of the NGO Kaloob in the Philippines...

Lay people, particularly in Korea and Vietnam, greatly support these commitments.

FUTURE PROSPECTS

- Work towards greater autonomy for the Vicariate
- Strengthen apostolic commitments common to the Vicariate
- Promote better mutual understanding between brothers through meetings, sessions and collaboration.
- Improve the work of the Commissions, especially Formation, Assumptionist Apostolates and Communications
- Strengthen the Secretariat and the Economic Council of the Vicariate

Implement the orientations of the Federation of Asian Bishops' Conferences (FABC) - which has just celebrated its 50th anniversary - by being attentive to new realities and the urgent need for the Church in Asia to evangelize the continent through dialogue with cultures, religions, the poor and ecology.

FROM FATHER LUCIEN TELOLAHY, PROVINCIAL OF MADAGASCAR

In the report by the Father Vicar of Asia-Oceania, I was struck by three things. First, the Vicariate of Asia-Oceania is very large and deserves to be considered,



before long, as a Vice-Province or even a Province. It is made up of several countries. Internationality and interculturality are very much in evidence: «We want to bear witness to the Kingdom by sharing common life despite our differences of language and culture» (Report of the Superior General, p. 21). Secondly, the Vicariate is very young,

and most of the people in charge of vital matters are young. For me, the Vicariate of Asia is the future of the Assumption, taking into account the demographic growth of religious vocations. Finally, Father Vicar's report, by evoking the trilogy (men of communion, proposing the faith, and in solidarity with the poor) invites each of us to progress as a disciple of Christ, as a brother living in community and as an apostle in the service of the Kingdom. This report is a call to each member of the body we form, to live and proclaim

hope in times of crisis.»
